Current NOTAM for Matamata Airfield. We were unsure how this affects winch launching. Discussion with Bruce Langlands (MPDC the airfield operator) says we can operate 28 normally and 10 on the Kaimai side of the airfield, but avoid landing on clubhouse half out from the fuel pump. The Nth West clubhouse side of the runway was damaged by NZ Aviation and it will take time for the ground to re-stabilise. He promised well over a month ago to change the NOTAM for gliding, but verbally confirmed we can continue operating the winch and launch from where we normally do. Keep a lookout for marker boards in
